Hailed for producing "the most surprising and brilliantly innovative collaborations in Kansas City," Bach Aria Soloists curates and delivers their critically-acclaimed concert series presenting the genius and relevance of Johann Sebastian Bach, his contemporaries, and those he inspired to today for our community, through exhilarating, multi-genre collaborations and BAS' BachReach education in the schools and for seniors. The ensemble's repertoire is adventurous and broad, including chamber music from Renaissance to Contemporary, vocal arias, Tango and new living composer commissions. Their signature arrangements can be heard in every concert bringing ancient and modern music to new life.

In 2022 and 2016, Bach Aria Soloists was awarded the USArtists International grant from the Mid-Atlantic Arts Foundation, National Endowment for the Arts and the Mellon Foundation. They were selected as a Finalist in the U.S. State Department's Cultural and Educational 2022 American Music Abroad program and named The Arts Organization of 2020 by the Missouri Arts Council.

Bach Aria Soloists have been invited to perform with trumpeter Rodney Marsalis at the Cayman Arts Festival in 2024. BAS was invited as Artist-in-Residence at the 2022 Thailand International Composition Festival. They presented the world premiere of Narong Prangcharoen's *Reticence* for Soprano, Violin, Cello and Harpsichord composed for BAS Founder Elizabeth Suh Lane; led a master class with composition students, and performed two concerts of diverse repertoire from Bach to Prangcharoen.

Collaboration is integral to Bach Aria Soloists' missiobn. Artistic partners have included internationally renowned musicians, dancers, scholars, actors, artists, including Dr. Christoph Wolff; trumpeter Rodney Marsalis; Grammy®-winning bandonéonist Héctor Del Curto and pianist Gustavo Casenave; Bobby Watson; the Grammy®-winning Kansas City Chorale; Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts; Heart of America Shakespeare Festival; contemporary dance ensembles Wylliams/Henry Contemporary Dance, Elizabeth Koeppen of Parsons Dance, the Owen/Cox Dance Group, and many more!

BachReach is BAS' innovative education program that has served tens of thousands of students presenting interactive music and multi-disciplinary showcases for urban and suburban schools; Artistic Director Elizabeth Suh Lane conducts Orchestral/Chamber music clinics and masterclasses for the top high school programs in the region. Elizabeth Suh Lane Founder · Artistic Director · Violin

Elizabeth Suh Lane has been described as a "phenomenal musician" by the violin pedagogue Max Rostal; and "among the finest chamber musicians in America today" by Michael Tilson Thomas. She has performed across the globe as a chamber and orchestral musician in the world's great concert halls: Carnegie, Suntory, Salzburg Festspielhaus, Berlin's Philharmonie, Theatre des Champs Elysée, Helzberg Hall. She was a first violinist with the London Symphony Orchestra under music directors Sir Colin Davis, Michael Tilson Thomas, Mstislav Rostropovich and many others. She toured the world with the Chamber Orchestra of Europe under Claudio Abbado, Nikolaus Harnoncourt, Gidon Kremer; and with the Academy of St. Martin-in the-Fields under Sir Neville Marriner. She has performed with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and has been invited to numerous international festivals: Tanglewood; Britten-Pears in England; Germany's Schleswig-Holstein; Japan's Pacific Music; and Carmel Bach Festival. She has served on the faculties of the Snowpond Chamber Music Seminar in Maine and the Brian Lewis Young Artists' Program instructing advanced violin students.

Elizabeth is Founder-Executive-Artistic Director and Violinist of the critically acclaimed Bach Aria Soloists, in Concert Season 24. Her leadership has brought world-class collaborations to Kansas City to partner with BAS, including: the world's preeminent scholar of Bach Dr. Christoph Wolff; Associate Director of Parsons Dance Elizabeth Koeppen; Guggenheim Award-winning composer Narong Prangcharoen. BAS gave the world premiere of his most recent work, *Reticence* for Soprano, Violin, Cello and Harpsichord in Thailand in 2022 which he composed for Bach Aria Soloists.

Collaboration is integral to Elizabeth's artistic direction of Bach Aria Soloists. Her extensive chamber music career has been blessed working with her BAS colleagues and musicians Matt Haimovitz, Andy Simionescu; Nokuthula Ngwenyama; Anna Lim; the Satterlee Piano Trio with Robert Satterlee. Elizabeth toured South America as first violinist of the Barbican String Quartet and she was selected to perform in the orchestra at Leonard Bernstein's Memorial Concert at St. John the Divine.

Elizabeth was a member of the London Symphony Orchestra Education team training teachers and students in schools across Great Britain. She conducts Strings Clinics for thousands of students throughout the metropolitan region via Bach Aria Soloists' BachReach offering free, innovative, interactive education to schools. Elizabeth was a Teaching Assistant at the Yale School of Music for Baroque violinist Jaap Schröder and continues her love of teaching today, mentoring a studio of young violinists who have received scholarships to major universities across the country. Elizabeth was the recipient of the 2023 Outstanding Music Educator Award and the Asian American Chamber of Commerce honored her with the Professional Leader of the Year Award for her success and significant contribution to music and education in the community. She received her Masters of Music from the Yale School of Music as a Phi Kappa Phi Scholar and Broadus Erle Memorial Scholar and was a Chancellor's Scholar at UMKC.

Sarah Tannehill Anderson Soprano

Sarah Tannehill Anderson is an extremely versatile musician who excels at opera, oratorio, choral music, contemporary works, and art song. In addition to being soprano of Bach Aria Soloists, she has performed with the Opera Company of Philadelphia, Boston Lyric, Opera Omaha, Fort Worth Opera, and the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

In Kansas City, Sarah is a member of the Lyric Arts Trio and former soprano of the Kansas City Chorale with whom she recorded five albums. Sarah has won two Grammy® Awards for

her work with the Kansas City Chorale. She is a featured soloist on the Chorale's recording, Life & Breath – Choral Works by René Clausen, which won the Grammy® Award in 2013 for Best Choral Performance. In 2016, Rachmaninoff: All-Night Vigil won the Grammy® for Best Choral Performance. Sarah and husband Sam Anderson sing with the Saint Tikhon Choir on their 2022 Grammy®-nominated recording of Benedict Sheehan's Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom.

Sarah has performed as soloist with many other regional ensembles including the Kansas City Symphony, the Kansas City Chamber Orchestra, the New Ear Ensemble, the Kansas City Ballet and the Heartland Men's Chorus.

She is the founder of Raise Your Voice, a digital hub for vocal training, and resides in the Union Hill neighborhood with her husband, baritone and music educator Sam Anderson.

Elisa Williams Bickers Harpsichord · Organ · Piano

Dr. Elisa Williams Bickers, FAGO, is the harpsichordist, organist, and pianist for the Bach Aria Soloists. She is the Associate Director of Music and Principal Organist at Village Presbyterian Church in Prairie Village, Kansas. She performs regularly in recital as a solo organist, harpsichordist, and accompanist, including with the Kansas City Symphony, Te Deum Chamber Choir and the Grammy-winning Kansas City Chorale. She has served on the faculties of the UMKC Conservatory and Washburn University as instructor of organ.

A native of Clinton, Maryland, Dr. Bickers began her organ studies with the Potomac Organ Institute. She has degrees in church music and organ performance from Texas Christian University and the University of Kansas. Her teachers have included Dale Krider, Joseph Butler and Michael Bauer. She was awarded the 2009 Carlin Award for excellence in teaching, the highest honor possible for graduate students at KU. She has competed and won prizes in the William Hall Competition, NYACOP and the International Buxtehude Competition. Most recently, she was awarded the Fellow certificate of the American Guild of Organists, the Guild's most prestigious certification. Dr. Bickers guided the installation of Richards, Fowkes & Co. (Opus 22) pipe organ at Village, which is a landmark instrument in this city. She was also the chair for New Music for the 2018 American Guild of Organists National Convention.

Hannah Collins Cello

Cellist Hannah Collins is a dynamic performer who uses diverse forms of musical expression and artistic collaboration to build community. Winner of the Presser Music Award and De Linkprijs for contemporary interpretation, she takes an active role in expanding the repertoire for the cello by commissioning new works and co-creating interdisciplinary projects— most recently working with visual artist Antonia Contro and violinist Clara Lyon on Correspondence, a multimedia installation exhibited at the Carrie Secrist Gallery in Chicago. Resonance Lines, her solo debut album on the Sono Luminus label, is an "adventurous, impressive collection of contemporary solo cello music," negotiated "with panache" (The Strad), pairing music by Benjamin Britten and Kaija Saariaho with commissioned works by Caroline Shaw and Thomas Kotcheff.

Over the past decade, New Morse Code, her "remarkably inventive and resourceful duo" (*Gramophone*) with percussionist Michael Compitello, has developed projects responding to our society's most pressing issues, including *The Emigrants*, a documentary chamber work by George Lam, *dwb (driving while black)*, a chamber opera by Roberta Gumbel and Susan Kander, and *The Language of Landscapes*, a multimedia work by Christopher Stark addressing the urgency of the climate crisis. They were named the winners of the 2020 Ariel

Avant Impact Performance Prize which supports the development of new works addressing sustainability and scientific innovation.

Solo and chamber music performances have taken Hannah to festivals such as Orford Centre d'arts, Kneisel Hall, Aldeburgh Festival, and Musique de Chambre à Giverny. She is a member of the Bach Aria Soloists, Cantata Profana, Grossman Ensemble, and A Far Cry. Praised for her "incisive, vibrant continuo" playing (S. Florida Classical Review), Hannah also appears regularly as a Baroque cellist with the Sebastians, Quodlibet Ensemble, and Trinity Baroque Orchestra.

Hannah earned a B.S. in biomedical engineering from Yale College and holds degrees in music from the Yale School of Music, the Royal Conservatory of The Hague, and City University of New York. She is an alumna of Ensemble Connect, a fellowship program of Carnegie Hall, The Juilliard School, and Weill Music Institute, and is currently Associate Professor of Cello at KU. www.hannahcollinscello.com

Can Balcik-Moretti Turkish-Uruguayan violinist

Can Balcik-Moretti is an avid solo, chamber, and orchestral musician as well as a passionate teacher. He currently serves as violin and viola faculty at William Jewell College and Teaching Artist and String Quartet Coach at Harmony Project KC.

During his early education, he served as principal second of the Dogus Cocuk Symphony and the Turkish National Youth Philharmonic Orchestra, touring all over Turkey and numerous countries in Europe. He was also actively involved in the chamber music residency program, through which he worked with leading quartets such as Brentano, the JACK, Ying, Lark, and many others. He served as the first violinist of the Terra Quartet, performing a wide range of works spanning from Baroque to new music. Together with its members, Can performed throughout the Midwest and premiered multiple compositions at the New Music Festival in Michigan. He has performed orchestral and chamber works in venues such as Beethovenfest in Bonn, Bozar in Brussels, Hagia Irene in Istanbul, and Enescu Festival in Bucharest. As a solo performer, Can has made live appearances in Turkish, Belgian, and Kansas City Radios, performing solo Bach and Turkish compositions.

Can completed his undergraduate studies at Dokuz Eylul University Conservatory under Jerrold Rubenstein and Joshua Epstein. He then moved to the U.S. to pursue a Master's Degree in violin performance at the University of Iowa, where he was awarded the Henry and Parker Pelzer Fellowship Award and served as concertmaster for the University Symphony. Can is currently working on his Doctoral Degree at UMKC, under the tutelage of Prof. Joseph Genualdi. During his time there, he performed for world class musicians such as Michael Stern and Ralph Evans, and had the opportunity to work with composer Aaron J. Kernis. He was also awarded the Concertmaster Assistantship for three years, serving as the concertmaster of the UMKC Symphony, Chamber, and Opera Orchestras.

In addition to his active performing and teaching career, Can has been working on many passion projects. In recent years, he has been experimenting with the performance practices of the Baroque Era and performed J. S. Bach's *Solo Sonatas and Partitas* in numerous events with a Baroque violin and bow. Can is currently in the process of recording new compositions by Chinese-American contemporary composers. He is also writing a method book of violin exercises which he has been testing among his teaching studio of more than thirty students.

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

Artistic Director

Matthew Christopher Shepard's unique career path has led him to concert halls conducting both professional orchestras and choirs, to collegiate and secondary school classrooms to guest conduct and lecture in musicology and church music, and to communities of faith to lead both Christian and Jewish worship services. His intellectual curiosity, fearless programming, and magnetic leadership have made him one of the most sought-after conductors in the region.

Mr. Shepard is founder and conductor of Te Deum, which has established itself as one of the premier choral ensembles in the midwest. He is frequently engaged as a conducting clinician, most recently with the American Choral Directors Association Kansas State Convention Honor Choir in 2021. With his growing reputation in the Early Music field, Mr. Shepard's work and contributions to the field have twice been featured in the publication *Early Music America*, and has presented lectures on historical chant performance, music history and performance practice. With Te Deum he has given period performances of great pillars of baroque music including Buxtehude's *Membra Jesu Nostri*, J.S. Bach's *St. John Passion*, and Bach's *B-Minor Mass*.

As an orchestral conductor, Mr. Shepard has conducted several ensembles in the area, including The Philharmonia of Greater Kansas City, the Kansas City Civic Orchestra, and the Kansas City Baroque. He has also served as orchestra director at Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas. In the summer of 2018 he was invited to conduct the closing orchestral concert of the American Guild of Organists National Convention in Helzberg Hall at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts.

Beginning his musical studies in woodwinds and voice, Mr. Shepard holds an undergraduate degree from William Jewell College, two master's degrees, studying both choral and orchestral conducting at the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music and Dance, and is pursuing Doctoral studies at the University of Illinois where he concurrently holds a teaching assistantship. Mr. Shepard has had additional conducting study as a fellow at the Conductors Institute at Bard College Conservatory under Maestro Leon Botstein and at the Oregon Bach Festival Composers Institute.
